

Q & A with Winter Opera

General Director Gina Galati and Music Director Steven Jarvi sit down to talk about their upcoming Seventh Season, Winter Opera's success and what they are really looking forward to this year.

What are you most looking forward to this season?

Gina: We are moving our offices to a new building with rehearsal space and practice rooms. I'm really looking forward to utilizing the space to expand our education and outreach programs.

What are the biggest challenges you face as an opera company?

Gina: Ticket sales, patron involvement and fundraising!

Steve: The biggest challenge is always money. Even when things are going well,

every question and answer usually comes back to what we can afford and how to continue to expand our donor base. This is the reality of the arts world and why it is so important for all of us to spread the word and keep developing the fantastic arts culture we have in St. Louis.

What do you like about performing in the Skip Viragh Center for the Arts?

Gina: Comfortable seats, great location, great acoustics, beautiful performing space and friendly staff.

Steve: We are so lucky to have such a comfortable, beautiful and acoustically satisfying venue. This is one of the most enjoyable places to hear opera in the region.

Steve has been Music Director for Winter Opera since 2010; what is it like working together?

Gina: Steve has a lot to offer as a Music Director, both as a colleague and a conductor. We have similar tastes and have the same goals: to put on the best operas we can and to stay on budget!

Steve: I really enjoy working with Gina because she has an incredible ear (and voice) for opera along with an incredible work ethic. No one works harder than Gina! We have very similar tastes in voices - we both love an Italian sound that is even from top to bottom. We also agree that casting is about finding someone that is not only a great voice but a nice and supportive colleague.

What do you love about opera?

Gina: Opera has stories that everyone can identify with and music that stirs the soul.

Steve: Opera combines all of my favorite things: lush orchestral music, the human

voice, story telling and theatrical drama. When I am conducting an opera it is the closest I will ever come to directing a film but it's as though you are editing the final cut in real time. The rush of helping the piece come to life and inspiring the drama is a nearly unexplainable thrill.

What are some dreams that you would like to see come true for Winter Opera?

Gina: A resident artists program. I would love to give opportunities to young artists who deserve to perform.

Steve: I'd like to see our audience double in the next three years and continue to expand the size of our orchestra and the visual scope of our productions.


