





Don Giovanni Synopsis

Act 1

Leporello, servant to Don Giovanni, complains about his lot in life as he keeps watch outside the Commendatore's home. Giovanni, in disguise, has entered the house to seduce the Commendatore's daughter, Donna Anna. She chases Giovanni into the street, trying to learn her attacker's identity. The Commendatore defends his daughter's honor but is killed by Giovanni. Donna Anna, who has gone for help, returns with her fiancé Don Ottavio, and together the pair vow to avenge her father's death.

Giovanni and Leporello encounter Donna Elvira, a former conquest of Giovanni. She has come to find Giovanni and have her own revenge (Ah chi mi dice mai). Leporello is left with the task of explaining, with the aid of his trusty catalogue, that Elvira is far from being the only lady Giovanni has seduced and abandoned (Madamina, il catalogo e questo).

Giovanni comes upon peasants celebrating the wedding of Zerlina and Masetto. To the displeasure of Masetto (Ho capito), Giovanni now turns his amorous attentions to Zerlina, and after clearing the scene of Masetto and the others, tells her she is made for better than this (La ci darem la mano). Elvira arrives and implores Zerlina to flee this reprobate (Ah fuggi il traditore). Ottavio and Anna, still un-aware of her attacker's identity, ask Giovanni for his help. Elvira re-appears to warn Anna not to trust Giovanni, who in turn protests that Elvira is simply delusional. At his departure, Anna now realizes that it was indeed Giovanni who murdered her father. Again she pledges vengeance (Or sai chi l'onore).

Giovanni calms the disgruntled Leporello, and anticipates an evening of drinking, dancing, and womanizing (Fin ch'han dal vino). Zerlina and Masetto re-appear. She asks Masetto to forgive her innocent diversion with Giovanni (Batti, batti). As all depart for the evening's festivities, the masked Anna, Ottavio and Elvira appear outside Giovanni's house. Leporello invites the unknown trio to the party, and the three plan their vengeance. During the dancing that follows, Giovanni attempts to drag Zerlina into an adjoining room, but is confronted by Anna, Ottavio and Elvira who drop their masks, and with the others accuse Giovanni of his vast crimes. Momentarily stunned, Giovanni nonetheless manages to escape.

Don Giovanni Synopsis Act 2

Fed up, Leporello decides to leave his master forever, but Giovanni bribes him to stay. He forces Leporello to exchange disguises, and then distract the conflicted Elvira. This leaves Giovanni free to serenade her charming maid (Deh vieni alla finestra). Masetto and friends arrive armed with weapons, looking for Giovanni. They come across Giovanni in Leporello's garments. Duped, Masetto shares his plan to murder the rascal Giovanni, only to be beaten up. Zerlina arrives to help Masetto heal his various wounds

(Vedrai, carino).

Later, Leporello, still believed by Elvira to be Giovanni, continues his attempts to flee her. Anna, Ottavio, Elvira, Zerlina and Masetto enter and denounce the supposed Giovanni. Fearing for his life, Leporello reveals his true identity and slips away from the accusers. Ottavio pledges revenge on Giovanni and asks the others to take care of his beloved Anna (Il mio tesoro). Elvira then contemplates her betrayal by Giovanni (Mi tradi).

Leporello and Giovanni meet in a cemetery, and discover the monument of the deceased Commendatore. His tomb bears an inscription pledging vengeance on his murderer. Giovanni mockingly asks him to dinner, and the Commendatore accepts.

Ottavio pledges his abiding love for Anna, who is as yet unwilling to marry until her father's death is avenged (Non mi dir).

Giovanni is now at home, dining with women and music. Elvira bursts in, exhorting Giovanni to finally change his life. He mocks her, and as she departs she sees the approaching statue of the Commendatore. The Commendatore demands that Giovanni repent, and when he stubbornly refuses, Giovanni meets his doom.
